**Beyond 2008 - A Global Forum on the 1998-2008
Review**

**of the United Nations General Assembly Special
Session on Illicit Drugs**

Background

In June 1998, the United Nations General Assembly met in a Special Session to address the world drug problem. The Session culminated in the adoption of a Political Declaration committing some 150 states to the achievement of significant and measurable results in reduction of the illicit supply and demand for drugs by the year 2008. Two other resolutions were adopted dealing with Guiding Principles of Demand Reduction and Measures to Enhance International Cooperation to Counter the Drug Problem.

Apart from the Member States' commitments and pledges adopted on June 10, 1998; the General Assembly, directly or indirectly, called upon NGOs to work closely with governments and others in assessing the drug problem, identifying viable solutions and implementing appropriate policies and programmes. Resolution 49/2 of the 49th session of the Commission on Narcotic Drugs calls for an increased participation by NGO representatives for the tenth anniversary of the twentieth special session of the General Assembly.

"Beyond 2008" is a joint initiative of the Vienna and New York NGO Committees on drugs to facilitate an effective contribution from NGOs to the UNGASS Review. The Vienna NGO Committee 2nd Vice Chair Michel Perron, Chief Executive Officer of the Canadian Centre on Substance Abuse chairs the Steering Committee. A formal governance structure consisting of the Steering Committee and a Program Committee has been established.

"Beyond 2008"

The target date of 2008 agreed at the 1998 UNGASS on Drugs for the achievement of "significant and measurable results" presents an opportunity for the NGO community to reflect on its own achievements in drug control, exchange ideas on promising new approaches, reach agreements on ways to work together and make recommendations to multilateral agencies and UN member states on future directions for drug control. Building on past experience, the Vienna NGO Committee will host "Beyond 2008" to contribute to the 1998-2008 review and agenda-setting exercise being undertaken by the Commission on Narcotic Drugs (CND).

Given the wide variety of views on how best to address drug problems today the Forum, preceded by six regional consultations, will strive to represent a broad range of experience and contributions. It is also acknowledged that drug policy spans a vast ideological continuum and this is also true of NGOs in the drugs field. That said, the Forum

and its regional consultations will focus on the value added benefit of NGOs themselves regardless of their ideological viewpoint.

Objectives

The "Beyond 2008" regional consultations and the Forum itself will focus on three specific objectives:

1. To highlight tangible NGO achievements in the field of drug control, with particular emphasis on contributions to the 1998 UNGASS Action Plan such as achievement in policy, community engagement, prevention, treatment, rehabilitation and social reintegration.
2. To review best practices related to collaboration mechanisms among NGOs, governments and UN agencies in various fields and propose new and/or improved ways of working with the UNODC and CND.
3. To adopt a series of high order principles, drawn from the Conventions and their commentaries, that would be tabled with UNODC and CND for their consideration and serve as a guide for future deliberations on drug policy matters.

The final output of the regional consultations and the NGO Forum will be formally presented to the CND for its consideration as it prepares its own review of achievement in the period 1998/2008 against the targets established at the UNGASS.

SUGGESTIONS FOR YOUR ARRIVAL:

If you land at Hong Kong International Airport, you may consider travel by the TurboJET Sea Express Ferry (www.turbojetseaexpress.com) to Macau without having to go through Hong Kong Immigration. Current schedules are 10H50, 14H00, 15H30, 19H00, 22H00, and do check-in at the Turbojet Sea Express counter (next to E-1 transfer area of the HKG Airport) at least one hour before departure, with your luggage receipts.

Should your flight be incompatible with the Turbojet Sea Express' schedule, you will have to go through Hong Kong Immigration, in order to board a high-speed ferry, available in town, just steps from Central Hong Kong (recommended) or the one from Kowloon. Departures are every 15 to 30 minutes and travel time is just 55 minutes. However, immigration and customs formalities are, again, necessary.

Once you disembark at the Macau Ferry Terminal: you may take The Venetian hotel shuttle bus to the hotel. This shuttle operates from 10am to midnight daily.

Naturally, the preferred and most convenient way to arrive in Macau is landing at the Macau International Airport. There will be also frequent Venetian Hotel shuttles buses.

INFORMATION on MACAU:

Location

Macau world heritage site is located at the entrance of the Pearl River Delta, 90 miles (144 Kilometres) southeast of Guangzhou and 40 miles (64 kilometres) southwest of Hong Kong. It covers a total area of 27.5 square kilometres, consisting of a mainland peninsula and two islands, Taipa and Coloane, linked by three modern bridges and a causeway. The territory is connected to mainland China at the Barrier Gate, the existing crossing point located at the northern part of the city. A new border between the reclamation areas of Coloane and Taipa has been opened, greatly improving the flow of goods and people between Macau and the Mainland.

Population and Language

Macau 's population stands at 469.8 thousand, of which over 96% are Chinese speaking, 2% Portuguese speakers. English is Macau's third language and is generally used in trade, tourism and commerce.

Political Background

In 1987 the Sino-Portuguese Joint Declaration on the future of Macau was signed by the People's Republic of China and the Portuguese Government. According to its provisions, China resumed sovereignty over Macau on December 20th, 1999. As a Special Administrative Region of China, Macau enjoys a high degree of autonomy.

Macau retains its political, economic and social system for 50 years, with its own executive, legislative and judicial authorities, at the same time continuing to enjoy all the advantages of free port status as a separate customs territory.

The Chinese government has affirmed its confidence in Macau's future prosperity and stability, which will help guarantee the success of its "One Country, Two Systems" policy.

Entry and Exit:

Macau International Airport

Tourists can use the Macau International Airport for travelling to several destinations in the region on direct flights or catch connecting flights to different parts of Asia, Europe or America. The airport is located on Taipa Island and is 15 minutes away from the Macau Ferry Terminal, 20 minutes from the Barrier Gate and only 10 minutes away from the COTAI Frontier Post. Hong Kong International Airport

Hong Kong has many facilities for Macau-bound travellers. The main sea terminal and heliport are located in Shun Tak Centre, on the waterfront West of Central District on Hong Kong Island. It is above Sheung Wan MTR station (Mass Transit Railway) and next to a terminus for buses and minibuses from many parts of Hong Kong, including the A2 Airbus from the airport. The terminal has passenger wharves and helipad, booking offices for current and advance sailings and flights, reservation offices of Macau hotels and travel agents, a branch of China Travel Service, and a Macau Government Tourist Office Information Counter. Visas:

All visitors must hold a passport or a valid travel document. Please note that the validity of these documents must not be less than 30 days since the day you enter Macau.

If travel arrangements are made through an agent, the visa processing is handled by Macau tour operators.

A. Visas are required by all visitors except

a) Residents of Macau;

b) Nationals of Andorra, Austria, Belgium, Brazil, Bulgaria, Cape Verde, Croatia, Czech, Cyprus, Denmark, Dominica, Egypt, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Japan, Latvia, Lebanon, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Mali, Malta, Mongolia, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovak, Slovenia, South Korea, Spain, Sweden, Tanzania and the United Kingdom(6 months) for a stay up to 90 days;

c) Nationals of Australia, Canada, Chile, India, Indonesia, Kiribati, Liechtenstein, Malaysia, Mexico, Monaco, Namibia, New Zealand, Philippines, Samoa, Seychelles, Singapore, South Africa, Switzerland, Thailand, Turkey, the United States of America and Uruguay for a stay up to 30 days;

d) Nationals of China with valid Macau entry/depart documents, including residents of Mainland China, Hong Kong, Taiwan and overseas Chinese for a stay of up to 30 days;

e) The "Hong Kong Identity Card", "Hong Kong Permanent Identity Card" or "Hong Kong Reentry Permit" holders may stay in Macau for a maximum period of one year.

f) Holders of Diplomatic Passport or "Laissez Passer" issued by the United Nations.

g) Holders of Consulate/Diplomatic documents issued by the Macau SAR or Hong Kong SAR.

B.Visas can be obtained from the Immigration Services through Embassies/Consulates of the PRC and should be used within the validity, the visa is expired after the valid date.

C.Visas are also available on arrival in Macau at the Immigration Services for a period of 30 days. There are three types:

1) Individual - MOP\$100, for individual traveler for a single stay of up to 30 days in Macau, children under 12 years of age pay MOP\$50.

2) 2) Family - MOP\$200 for couples, husband travelling with wife and or children (under 12 years of age) of same surname or on proof of their relationship.

3) 3) Group - MOP\$50 per person for *bonafide* groups of 10 or more and children aged 12 or under.
